## General Rules and Regulations

- Premiums will not be paid on articles removed from the Fair before it closes UNLESS special approval of the superintendent of the department has been given.
- All articles must be entered in the name of the owner. Dairy products, fruits, grain, vegetables must have been made or raised by the exhibitor thereof. Descriptive labels, in accordance with the entries, can be secured from the superintendents who shall attach them to the articles and allow them to remain during the Fair.
- No exhibitor shall compete against himself either directly or indirectly, and any person entering borrowed articles, vegetables, or other products, or making fraudulent representations in reference to any exhibit will forfeit all premiums which may have been awarded. The Association also reserves the right to accept or reject any entry made for any premium offered and no premium will be paid unless all requirements are fulfilled. Premiums earned will be paid by check and those checks will be mailed to the exhibitor no later than November $1^{\text {st }}$ of the current year. Any check not cashed within 60 days of issue date will be considered a donation to the Fair Association.
- The Association will employ a watchman on the grounds at night and exercise due care, but they will assume no responsibility for any loss or damage from any cause that may occur to any animal or article exhibition, and upon this condition only are entries received.

1. Articles exhibited must represent work since last September and not have been exhibited in the Scouts BSA exhibit at the Granite State Fair in the past. 2. Exhibits submitted must be clean, whole, and complete. All paint must be dry. Exhibits are to be age/rank appropriate. The guidelines of the BSA will be taken into consideration as to the appropriateness of the exhibits. No Lego constructions.
3. Exhibits will be judged on creativity, quality, skill, and age level. Judges have the option of disqualifying any item deemed inappropriate to the exhibitor's abilities.
4. Due to limited space, we may not have enough room for larger items. Contact superintendents prior to preregistering for any items larger than a display board.

| Wood: No items created from kits are acceptable. All wooden parts are to have been cut, shaped, sanded, finished, etc. by the entrant. Exception is made for minor turned parts such as dowels, knobs, etc. <br> Fasteners: In general, fasteners should not be visible. This is particularly true for nails. Screws for hinges, locks, and other typically metal parts are allowed. For reproductions and period pieces, cut nails may be visible as style allows/requires. <br> Techniques: Entries should display average joinery techniques with fine joint lines and tight joints. Typically, joints such as dovetails, mortises, thru Tenon, and bridal joints are used. <br> Finish: All items should be fully finished in accordance with the styles of each piece. All surfaces should be smooth and pleasant to touch. Exceptions are made for work that should show hand tooling as Early American, or for artistic purposes.
